The Conservation Society concurs with the OHP staff recommendations for the following items: A-5, 151 East Travis Street; A-9, 106 Jefferson Street; B-18, 515 Burleson Street; B-19, 1939 West Gramercy Place; B-25, 307 Delaware; B-26, 133 West Craig Place; B-27, 1431 Rosewood Avenue; B-33 310 Callaghan Avenue, especially the portion relating to demolition; and finally, B-34, 1434 Fulton Avenue.

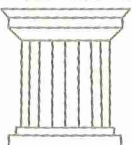
