RE: Agenda Item 35 –200 Block of Perez Street

Perez Street provides a vital connection to San Antonio's early 19th century Spanish heritage and should not be renamed. Its name honors Lt. Col. Ignacio Perez; Ad-Interim Governor of Spanish Texas and founder of an influential ranching family in early San Antonio. This street also embodies a rare remnant of the Westside Laredito neighborhood, both in its landmarked historic structures at 215 and 219 Perez, and in its name.

The Society has long opposed renaming historic streets because this erodes public knowledge of our shared history. We joined with the Office of Historic Preservation in opposing this name change in 2012 and, again, this year. In 2012, University Health System withdrew its request to rename this street in Judge Robert B. Green's honor. Mark Webb, a senior vice president, explained to the *San Antonio Express-News* that, "we didn't realize the greater significance of the current name. So, out of respect, we decided to withdraw our request."

Whether University Health System remains intent on honoring Robert B. Green, in addition to the medical campus named for him, or is seeking improved wayfaring signage, a compromise solution that preserves the Perez Street name must be found. Utilizing Robert B. Green Way as a memorial street name provides an alternative to supplanting a very specific and visible tie to our city's Spanish roots.
