Francis X. Galán is an Associate Professor of History at Texas A&M University-San Antonio where he teaches courses on Latin America, Mexico, Texas, and the Caribbean. He received his PhD in history from Southern Methodist University, MA in history from UTSA, and BA in Latin American Studies from UT-Austin. His book, Los Adaes: The First Capital of Spanish Texas, was published in 2020 by Texas A&M University Press, College Station, through the Summerfield G. Roberts Texas History Series. Dr. Galán won the 2022 Book Award from the Texas Old Missions and Forts Restoration Association and was a Finalist for the 2021 Ramirez Family Award for Most Significant Scholarly Book from the Texas Institute of Letters.
