Char Miller is the W. M. Keck Professor of Environmental Analysis and History at Pomona College, and taught for many years at Trinity University. He has written extensively about San Antonio in such books as San Antonio: A Tricentennial History (2018), Deep in the Heart of San Antonio: Land and Life in South Texas (2004), On the Edge: Water, Immigration, and Politics in the Southwest (2013) and San Antonio: An Environmental History (2005). In 2021, he published Westside Rising: How San Antonio's 1921 Flood Destroyed a City and Sparked a Latino Environmental Justice Movement and edited its companion volume, La Tragedia de la Inundacion de San Antonio/San Antonio's Tragic Flood. Although he now lives in Southern California and loves much about the region, that does not include the Los Angeles Lakers: he remains a die-hard Spurs fan.
